
Palestinian universities join SAP program to boost IT skills

Eight Palestinian universities have joined SAP's **University Alliances** program to develop highly qualified graduates with critical skills for the 21st century workforce. At an event in Ramallah today (29 April 2015), Marita Mtschein, SAP's Senior Vice President for Strategic Investments and Managing Director for **SAP Training & Development Institute** in the Middle East and North Africa, and representatives of the universities signed a series of agreements that will lead to significant opportunities for the Palestinians.

The agreements were facilitated by the Office of the Quartet Representative as part of its work to help develop the Palestinian economy. OQR worked with SAP leaders in the Middle East and North Africa region to connect them with the Palestinian universities. The goal is to enable universities and students in IT or business studies to access SAP-developed curricula, allowing them to gain the skills and experience needed to work in a global high-tech environment.

In addition to the University Alliances programme, SAP's intention is to help create a roadmap for jobs through the SAP Young Professional Program for graduates holding business, science, finance and information technology degrees.
