Summary statement by the Secretary-General on matters of which the Security Council is seized and on the stage reached in their consideration

- 1. Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General wishes to submit hereunder the list of items of which the Security Council is currently seized, with references in parentheses to the previous summary statements that have been issued covering consideration of each item 1
- 2. It will be recalled that, in the interest of economy, the Secretary-General reproduces only once annually the full, up-to-date list of items of which the Security Council is seized. In fulfilment of his responsibility under rule 11, an addendum to the basic list is issued weekly, making reference to those items on which further action has been taken by the Council during the week covered or indicating that there has been no change during that period.
- 3. The last full summary statement (S/2005/15) was issued on 25 February 2005. The last weekly addendum (S/2005/15/Add.51) covered developments up to 31 December 2005
- 4. During the period since the last full summary statement, the Security Council included the following item in the agenda of its 5121st meeting, held on 15 February 2005, and concluded its consideration of the item at the same meeting:
