Letter dated 14 February 2012 from the Chair of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People addressed to the President of the General Assembly

I have the honour to inform you that, by a letter dated 13 February 2012 addressed to the Chair of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of Ecuador conveyed the decision of his Government to become a member of the Committee, to which it had already been granted observer status (see annex).

The Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, at its 339th meeting, held on 13 February 2012, welcomed the decision of Ecuador and approved its request. In the view of the Committee, this reflects the growing international support for its efforts to achieve a comprehensive, just and lasting settlement of the question of Palestine.

In light of the above, and since the membership of the Committee has been established by the General Assembly, I have the honour to request that you bring the matter to the attention of the Assembly for its approval.
