Sir,

I am directed to refer to your letter No. 406 of 5th April to the District Commissioner of the Jerusalem District requesting permission to establish a wireless transmitter and receiver in your Consulate General.

2. I am to inform you that if you will apply to the Postmaster General, who is the competent authority, a licence will be issued subject to acceptance of the following conditions:-

- (a) that the type, wavelength and power of the transmitter shall be agreed with the Postmaster General.
- (b) that the installation shall not be used before 15th May except by prior agreement with this Government and after 15th May except with the agreement of the successor authority.
