Statement by the Twelve on the closing of the schools of the the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine

Refugees in the Near East in the West Bank

(Madrid, 31 May 1989)

The Twelve express their serious concern about the persistent decision of the Israeli authorities of keeping the schools closed in the West Bank, including the schools of the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East.

The Twelve consider that this measure, which is contrary to the basic right to education, threatens the future of a whole generation of young
Palestinians and contributes to increasing the level of tension in the Occupied Territories, thus obstructing the task of building confidence which, in the
view of the Twelve, is essential if the peace process is to prosper. The Twelve, therefore, call again upon the Israeli authorities to reconsider their
policy urgently.
