Fifty-eighth year**Identical letters dated 1 May 2003 from the Permanent Observer of
Palestine to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General
and the President of the Security Council**

In the immediate wake of the presentation yesterday of the Quartet's road map to the Israeli and Palestinian sides, Israel, the occupying Power, has chosen to continue waging its bloody military campaign against the Palestinian civilian population under its occupation. In a span of less than 24 hours, the Israeli occupying forces have killed at least 21 Palestinians, including men, women and children. Tragically, despite renewed efforts towards peace, the occupying Power continues to commit war crimes, State terrorism and systematic human rights violations against the Palestinian people throughout the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem.

As reflected in the list of Palestinian martyrs annexed to the present letter, the Israeli occupying forces have continued to kill Palestinian civilians on an almost daily basis. The excessive and indiscriminate use of force by the Israeli occupying forces during invasions and assaults on Palestinian civilian areas, in addition to the ongoing illegal Israeli practice of extrajudicial executions, have ensured the mounting of Palestinian casualties with each passing day.

Today alone, at least 15 Palestinians, including three children and a mentally handicapped man, were killed by the occupying forces. The majority of those killed today were killed by the occupying forces during an attack on the densely populated Shjaiyah neighbourhood of Gaza City. In the darkness of night, shortly after midnight, the Israeli occupying forces, including nearly 60 tanks and armoured personnel carriers backed by helicopter gunships, raided the area, laying siege to and targeting the home of a Palestinian man, Yussef Khaled Abu Hein, who was killed in the attack. The tank shells, helicopter missiles and machine-gun fire unleashed by the occupying forces killed a total of 13 Palestinians and wounded more than 65 others, 12 of them reported to be in critical condition. Among those killed were a 2-year-old boy, Amer Ahmed Ayad, who was shot in the head as he peered out of the window of his home, and two teenage boys, Mohammed Abdel Nasser Al-Dahdouh, 13 years old, and Ahmed Ramadan Al-Titr, 15 years old, who were both killed by bullets to the head as they tried to flee from the shooting. In addition, two Palestinian men were killed today by the occupying forces in the village of Yatta near the city of Al-Khalil. These killings were preceded yesterday by the several other killings by the occupying forces, including a 60-year-old woman in Gaza, Subeih Muslim Abu Atwa, who died from several gunshot wounds, and a 31-year-old Palestinian farmer, Rayeq Masood Ghoori Al-Durghameh, in from the village of T oobas near the city of Nablus.

These brutal killings by the Israeli occupying forces, in addition to Israel's continuing demolition of Palestinian homes, ongoing raids of Palestinian cities, towns, villages and refugee camps rising detention of Palestinian civilians and continuing imposition of the severest restrictions on the movement of persons and goods throughout the Occupied Palestinian Territory, have ensured the continuation of widespread fear and panic and intense frustration and tension among the Palestinian civilian population. This death, destruction and loss being inflicted by Israel, the occupying Power, on the Palestinian people under its occupation will surely, if it continues, undermine and potentially destroy any efforts towards an end to the violence and a genuine resumption of the peace process between the two sides.

The recent confirmation of a new Palestinian cabinet, headed by the first Palestinian Prime Minister, Mahmoud Abbas, along with the presentation of the Quartet's road map and their stated intention to intensify peace efforts, present a new opportunity for pursuing peace between the two sides that should not be sabotaged. As such, continuing Israeli aggressions against the Palestinian people should be vigorously condemned by the international community and all efforts must be exerted to compel Israel to cease its military campaign against the Palestinian people and to adhere to international law and international humanitarian law, particularly the Fourth Geneva Convention. Only under such conditions can the tragic cycle of violence be stemmed and can an environment conducive to peace efforts become a reality.

This letter is in follow-up to our previous 163 letters to you regarding the ongoing crisis in the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, since 28 September 2000. These letters, dated from 29 September 2000 ([A/55/432-S/2000/921](#)) to 9 April 2003 ([A/ES-10/224-S/2003/416](#)), constitute a basic record of the crimes committed by the Israeli occupying forces against the Palestinian people since September 2000. For all of these war crimes, State terrorism and systematic human rights violations committed against the Palestinian people, Israel, the occupying Power, must be held accountable and the perpetrators must be brought to justice.

Accordingly, in follow-up to the above-mentioned letters, it is my regret to inform you that, since our last letter to you, the Israeli occupying forces have killed at least 59 Palestinians, including children, raising the total number of martyrs to 2,365 Palestinians. (The names of the martyrs that have been identified thus far are contained in the annex to the present letter.)

I should be grateful if you would arrange to have the present letter and its annex distributed as a document of the tenth emergency special session of the General Assembly, under agenda item 5, and of the Security Council.
