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





Palestinian civilians living in the occupied Palestinian territory (oPt) continue to bear the brunt of ongoing conflict and Israeli occupation. A lack of respect for international humanitarian and human rights law has resulted in a protection crisis with serious and negative humanitarian consequences.

In the Gaza Strip, Israel continues to impose a land, sea and air blockade that has significantly undermined livelihoods, seriously diminished the quality of, and access to, basic services, and which amounts to collective punishment of the population of the Gaza Strip.

In the West Bank, East Jerusalem is isolated from the rest of the West Bank. Communities in Area C face a range of pressures, including demolitions, settler violence, and movement and access restrictions, that make meeting basic needs increasingly difficult and threaten Palestinian presence in the area. Bedouin and herder communities are particularly vulnerable. Unlawful Israeli settlement activity lies at the heart of many of the humanitarian difficulties facing Palestinians in the West Bank.

Overall, the lack of accountability for violations of human rights and humanitarian law, along with a failure to effectively enforce the rule of law when it comes to attacks on Palestinians and their property by Israeli military forces or Israeli settlers, has created a climate of impunity that contributes to further violence.

## Key Facts on the oPt



**4.2 million** Palestinians live in the oPt, with 2.5 million in the West Bank and 1.6 million in the Gaza Strip.



**Nearly 44%** of the oPt population are refugees and nearly 50% is below the age of 18.\*



**38%** of the population of the Gaza Strip and **18.3%** of the West Bank live in poverty.



**33%** of the population of the oPt is food insecure.



**28%** unemployment rate in the Gaza Strip and **20%** in the West Bank



**73** litres/capita/day (l/c/d) is the average water consumption in the West Bank and **80-90** l/c/d in the Gaza Strip, below the WHO standard of 100 l/c/d.



**5.8 persons** is the average Palestinian household size in the oPt.



**500,000 Israeli settlers** live in 150 settlements and 100 outposts in the West Bank, in contravention of international law.

The oPt population is only 38% of the global Palestinian population, projected at 11.2 million people, approximately 44% of which are refugees registered with the UN. Outside the oPt, 1.4 million Palestinians live in Israel, 5 million live in Arab countries and 640,000 in other parts of the world.




**THE WEST BANK BARRIER**

A complex series of concrete walls, electronic fences and other obstacles to control Palestinian pedestrian and vehicular movement. Construction of the Barrier within the West Bank including East Jerusalem continues, contrary to the advisory opinion of the International Court of Justice.



Controls movement through the West Bank Barrier. Permits, or prior coordination, are required for Palestinians to access their lands.



**CLOSURE**

A policy of physical barriers, permit requirements and other administrative restrictions are used to control Palestinian pedestrian and vehicular movement.

☒ CHECKPOINT



A barrier staffed by the Israeli Army and/or Border Police with observation towers and/or other physical structures used to control pedestrian and vehicular access.

☒ PARTIAL CHECKPOINT



An established checkpoint operating periodically.

☒ OBSERVATION TOWER



An elevated military tower to monitor/control Palestinian pedestrian and vehicular access.


Continuous fencing along roads which prevents Palestinian vehicular, agricultural and pedestrian access to roads used by Israeli settlers.




### KEY FACTS


- Over 60 percent of the West Bank is considered Area C, where Israel retains control over planning and zoning among other issues.
- An estimated 150,000 Palestinians live in Area C, including 27,500 Bedouin and other herders.
- More than 20% of communities in Area C have extremely limited access to health services.
- Water consumption dips to 20 litres/capita/day (l/c/d) in communities without water infrastructure, one-fifth of the World Health Organisation's recommendation.
- Communities depending on tankered water pay up to 400% more for every liter than those connected to the water network.
- 70% of Area C is off-limits to Palestinian construction; 29% is heavily restricted.
- Less than 1% of Area C has been planned for Palestinian development by the Israeli Civil Administration.
- 560 Palestinian-owned structures were demolished, including 200 residential structures and 46 rainwater cisterns and pools, by the Israeli authorities in Area C in 2011.
- 1,006 people, including 565 children, lost their homes in 2011, over twice as many as in 2010.
- Over 3,000 demolition orders are outstanding, including 18 targeting schools.
- The planned expansion area of the around 135 Israeli settlements in Area C is 9 times larger than their built-up area. (B'Tselem).
- Approximately 300,000 settlers currently live in Area C.





The Barrier's total length is approximately 708 km. 61.8% of the Barrier is complete; a further 8.2% is under construction and 30% is planned but not yet constructed. When completed, approximately 85% of its route will run inside the West Bank, isolating 9.4% of West Bank territory, including East Jerusalem and No-Man's Land. On 9 July 2004, the International Court of Justice (ICJ) issued an advisory opinion which stated that the sections of the Barrier route which ran inside the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, violates Israel's obligations under international law.

Palestinian communities are affected by the Barrier in a number of ways:

- In much of the West Bank, Palestinian rural communities have land and water resources cut off between the Barrier and the Green Line (the 'Seam Zone'). To access this land, much of which has been declared a 'closed military area', farmers are obliged to use a 'prior coordination' mechanism or to obtain 'visitor' permits from the Israeli authorities. Access is channelled through a gate designated on the permit. Currently there are 66 Barrier gates, the majority of which only open during the olive harvest season. The limited allocation of these permits, together with the restricted number and opening times of the Barrier gates, have severely curtailed agricultural practice and undermined rural livelihoods throughout the West Bank.
- The intrusive route of the Barrier also isolates approximately 6,500 Palestinians in the closed area between the Green Line and the Barrier, with those aged 16 and above required to apply for 'permanent resident' permits to continue to live in their own homes. Residents have to pass through Barrier checkpoints to reach workplaces and essential services, and to maintain family and social relations on the 'Palestinian' side of the Barrier. If the Barrier is completed as planned, approximately 25,000 West Bank Palestinians will reside between the Barrier and the Green Line. The majority of Palestinians who hold East Jerusalem ID cards will also reside between the Barrier and the Green Line.
- The Barrier has also adversely affected the West Bank's urban centres, in particular East Jerusalem. It is transforming the geography, economy and social life not only of Palestinians who reside within the Israeli-defined municipal area of East Jerusalem, but also residents of the wider metropolitan area, with Palestinian neighbourhoods and suburbs divided from each other and walled out from the urban centre.




**KEY FACTS**

- The weekly average of settler attacks resulting in Palestinian casualties and property damage increased by 32% in 2011 compared to 2010, and by over 144% compared to 2009.
- In 2011, three Palestinians have been killed and 183 injured by Israeli settlers. In addition, one Palestinian has been killed, and 125 others injured, by Israeli soldiers during clashes between Israeli settlers and Palestinians.
- In 2011, about 10,000 Palestinian-owned trees, primarily olive trees, have been damaged or destroyed by Israeli settlers, significantly undermining the livelihoods of hundreds of families.
- In 2011, 139 Palestinians were displaced due to settler attacks, with some affected families moving to Areas A and B.
- Over 90% of monitored complaints regarding settler violence filed by Palestinians with the Israeli police in recent years have been closed without indictment.
- OCHA has identified over 80 communities with a combined population of nearly 250,000 Palestinians vulnerable to settler violence, including 76,000 who are at high-risk.








### NUMBER OF DEMOLISHED PALESTINIAN OWNED STRUCTURES AND DISPLACED PEOPLE 2009 - 2011







# WASH WATER SCARCITY VULNERABILITY MAPPING

AS OF JULY 2011

## HIGH RISK

13,723 people in 99 communities are considered at high risk of chronic water scarcity: accessing less than 30 LPCPD (Litres per Capita per Day), often paying more than 20NIS/cum, having no network nor adequate water storage and relying on low quality water; these communities are mostly found in Area C.

## MEDIUM RISK

296,066 people in 234 communities are considered at medium risk of acute water scarcity: accessing less than 60 LPCPD often having no network connection or a non functioning water supply network, therefore relying on water storage with low to medium quality water. These communities are often found in Area B or C and see a rapid increase of vulnerability over the summer season.




WASH emergency water scarcity distribution response in Massafer Yatta, Autumn 2011 . Credit GVC.

## Triggers of Water Scarcity:

- I. As a range of restrictions virtually eliminate the possibility of obtaining a building permit in Area "C" for Palestinians, it is nearly impossible to implement mitigation measures which could help increase the resilience of water scarce communities, most of whom are located in Area C. Moreover, the continued demolition of resilience infrastructure, such as water cisterns, further increases the dependency of the most vulnerable communities on water tankering.
- II. Over the last decade, rainwater catchment has been below average in the West Bank. In 2010-2011, the rainfall registered only 72 % of the historical average at the end of the raining season, with figures below 50% for the Eastern shores of the West Bank. The 2010-2011 shortage in rainfall had immediate impact on water access for vulnerable communities: households have been reported to fill cisterns at only a third of their capacity.
- III. Communities which are not connected to the water network traditionally depend on water tankering. While in 2010, people started purchasing water only in May, in 2011, a quarter of the households in the southern West Bank had already started purchasing water in February, and over half of households had started by mid-April. As the number of months during which households are dependent on water tankering increases rapidly, and as the number of these households keeps rising, the prices for tankered water rises exponentially.
- IV. The limited or non-existent replenishment of the aquifer leaves the springs and wells dry, meaning connected communities will have limited or no access to running water over summer. As a result, they will also have to rely on water tankering, leading to an increase in lines in front of water filling points.




## PARTIAL CHECKPOINTS
