ANNEX

Declaration by the twelve member States of the European Community concerning Israel's settlement policy, issued at Brussels, on 14 September 1987

The Ministers for Foreign Affairs of the Twelve member States of the European Community have noted with serious corearn the continuing Israeli policy of establishing new settlements in the occupied territories, most recently at the Avnei Hefetz site on the West Bank.

They reiterate their strong conviction that progress towards a just, comprehensive and lasting peace in the region depends on the creation of a climate of confidence between the parties to the conflict. The Twelve believe that the opening of new settlements, as well as the disturbing increase of the number of settlers in existing settlements, pose a serious risk of jeopardizing the prospects for peace.

They consider that every new and every existing settlement is in violation of international law and call upon the Government of Israel to put an end to the illegal policy of settlements in the occupied territories.
